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



#### June Tour 2016



#### A-B-C OF V-8 ENGINE TUNE-UP(Cont. from June!)

#### FORD SERVICE BULLETIN for September-October, 1933

K	Test the length of the spark from the spark plug end of each spark plug wire. Merely lift the wire from each spark plug in turn, holding the wire 3%" away from the cylinder head. The spark should jump this gap without missing. If this is true at all of the 8 wires, proceed with paragraph "L," otherwise follow procedure outlined on page 128.
1	Stop engine and install spark plug nuts

#### (Continued

- Stop engine and install spark plug nuts.
- M Adjust fan belt if necessary.
- Inspect hose connections for signs of leakage.
- Tighten intake manifold nuts. Stop any vacuum leaks at manifold or at windshield wiper or distributor vacuum lines.
- P Tighten cylinder head nuts.
- Orain sediment from fuel pump.
- R Clean fuel pump screen.
- S Blow through fuel line to check for obstructions.
- T Drain carburetor bowl.
- Start engine. If fuel pump primes and engine starts in 20 seconds, or less, fuel pump is O. K.
- Allow engine to run sufficiently long to warm up before adjusting carburetor. While the engine is warming up check for dragging brakes and incorrect toe-in and wheel bearing adjustment. Tires should be inflated to recommended pressure. These checking operations rightfully belong in the engine tune up as they affect the efficiency and performance of the car. The balance of the time while you are waiting for engine to warm up can be spent to good advantage by testing lights for burned out bulbs, cleaning windshield and rear windows, and such other services as should be performed before the car is delivered.
- Adjust throttle plate adjusting screw to an idle speed of from 5 to 7 miles per hour in high gear.
- X Adjust metering pin to leanest mixture possible without lowering the idling speed.
- Road test car. If engine pings under load, adjust vacuum brake just enough to remove the ping. If the engine does not ping, back off vacuum brake until engine does ping. Then adjust just enough to remove the ping. In some instances where original adjustment has been changed it will be necessary to change the spark advance adjustment (right side of distributor) to obtain peak performance as indicated by road test. (A timing fixture that will restore original adjustment will be available in a few days.)
- With car in high gear, drive at 5 to 7 miles per hour; gradually apply brakes, at the same time open throttle so as to maintain the speed of 5 to 7 miles per hour. Increase load until each impulse of the engine can be felt. If the engine misses, this fact can be determined at this time. If the procedure already outlined has been followed religiously the miss probably is due to a sticking valve which was not sticking during the compression test. A loss of compression noted only when the engine is warm, may indicate incorrect valve clearance between the valve stem and the push rod.


