

Getting to Know You

Featuring Ron + Kathy Shedd

Ron was born in San Diego, lived in the Bostonia area for two years and then raised in El Cajon. Ron was around twelve when his dad started taking him to Pearson Ford on the weekends where he worked in the upholstery department. His dad would also do custom upholstery at home. Ron's dad exposed him to the Sprint races which were held down at the old Balboa stadium. Between the above and taking auto shop, Ron was hooked on cars.

Ron started working at Pearson Ford in the paint and body shop when he was fourteen. A fellow work-



er found an old Model "A" coupe and offered it to him. Answering with "yes", his first project began. At the same time, Ron's dad acquired a 1936 Ford pickup truck which he ended up working on also. Since the truck was finished first and Ron getting his driver's license, you can guess what he chose to drive.

Over the years, Ron has owned mainly older Fords. These include a '60 Starliner, '61 Starliner, '63 Ford 406 - 4 speed, '48 Ford sedan, '36 Ford sedan delivery, '55 Chevy and eight Corvettes.

One might say, Ron likes cars!

Kathy and her twin sister were born in Los Angeles where they lived with their older sister for four years. Since her dad worked for ATT and was climbing the corporate ladder, they moved a lot. From

Los Angeles they moved to Palo Alto, on to New Jersey, back to Menlo Park and on to San Fernando Valley. Then when going into the 10th grade, she moved to La Mesa. Always being an outdoors person, Kathy's love was that of horses. Riding whenever she could was where you would find her. Being a family of girls, she was not exposed to the car world!

Ron and Kathy first met in 1961 where they both attended Grossmont High School. At that time, Ron's ride was the 1936 Ford pickup truck. They dated for about a





year when Ron was approached by Kathy's dad who asked him to step aside so that she might date others. Ron obliging the rather larger man, broke off the relationship. Little did Kathy's dad know that after many years apart, Ron and Kathy would reconnect in 2004. After dating for a bit, they knew that they would be together again. With good memories shared of the old truck, they decided to get involved with vintage cars, preferably a 1936. In March of 2006, a 1936 Five-Window Business Coupe got their attention. After flying to Seattle, Washington, the beautiful black car was on its way California and thus their new adventure started.

After finding a local group of old car enthusiasts, they met Leonard and Lynn Kunce. Soon after that, they were introduced to the Palomar Mountain Early Ford V-8 Club. This happened just before the 2007 Western Regional Meet that the club was putting on. Being interested in finding out how close to original their car was, they entered the car in the Concourse division of the show. They came away with a list of items that needed to be done if their '36 was to ever receive a Dearborn award. They decided that this car deserved the chance and thus the project of restoration began.

A major hurdle soon arose when the fires of 2007 hit. They received a phone call a 4:30 a.m. and were

forced to evacuate. Ron was able to pull the trailer out and load the '36 while Kathy scrambled to grab a few possessions from the house. They said good-bye to the house as they watched the flames coming closer. It turned out that they were the lucky ones and came back to a home still standing while those around them had burned. There was fire damage to their home which took the next year to repair.

It was finally time to start the restoration. After many long months of hard work, our 1936 was ready to be judged again. Yes, it now has its Dearborn and its Emeritus awards and Shedds' are thrilled.



Along with the 1936, Ron and Kathy have added to their collection a 1934 Tudor Sedan and a 1940 Tudor Sedan however, both are modified.

We must add one more thing – the people that we have met and have gotten to know through the love of our 1936 are all very special to us. You will always bring smiles to our faces. Thank you!



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
