GETTING TO KNOW YOU ... Norman & Peggy Petrucci... Our story.

Norm's recollections . . .

It was sometime in 1947 my parents, both Italian immigrants, decided to move from Detroit. My dad, who worked for Ford Motor Company from around 1937 wanted to pursue his life long dream and move his family to a warm climate so he and my Mom could have a big garden, fruit trees and raise chickens. They had some family friends they knew from Italy that lived in the San Fernando Valley in Southern California, what could be better. My older sister had just graduated from high school and my brother had one year to finish high school in Southern California. And for me, I could start first grade.

As we began to get settled, my dad opened up a auto repair business in Reseda that he operated for about 5 or 6 years until he could afford to by a piece of property and build his own garage. During that time my brother was drafted and spent a couple of years in Korea, My introduction to the "automobile" began in his absence. I was in elementary school and after school, I would walk from the school to my dads garage. Change my clothes and wash parts in what else, gasoline. This was a five (5) days and Saturday affair.

After my brother returned from the Army, I was still called upon to help in garage. Over the years I learned a ton! My dad was a machinist in addition to a excellent automobile mechanic. He made a point to teach me all aspects of running a complete auto repair shop including the machine work required like boring, pin fitting, valve and seat grinding, etc. Although, things were a lot simpler in those days. My dad still had to know not only all the different makes of cars but everything from the front bumper to the rear bumper.

It was a fantastic experience for me for several years. In those days most auto parts houses, as they were called, had a machine shop in the back that handled all the carry in items to be machined. I worked as a automotive machinist for a couple of years before going back to work for my dad.

As time moves on and my time in the Army was completed, the aerospace industry was going strong. So I went to work for Douglass Aircraft Co, soon to be Douglass Space and Missile and ultimately McDonnell Douglass. Working there in 1966 is where Peggy and I met, we married in 1968.

I have to say, although (or maybe because of) my dad worked for Ford, he didn't have much good to say about them. As a result, my family were die in the wool GM people. When I was in high school, all the cool guys had Forty Fords, 32 Fords and 34 Fords, soooooooo that's where I am now and finding and joining the Early Ford club has been a fantastic experience for both of us. As a result, I love my Fords, my Chevys, my Oldsmobile's and everything else that has 4 wheels.

When we moved to Murrieta from Mission Viejo we were still working. At that time we had a 58 Corvette and a 55 Chevy. We

joined the TVCC (Temecula Valley Car Club) and met Marv and Ruth Zepede and Bud and Marge Gilroy. We would go to Siggy's and that's where we met Bud Williams, and Frosty. Bud kept telling me about the Palomar Mountain V-8 club. Peggy was retired

by then so we decided to join the "Ford" club. The first meeting Peggy attended alone because I was out of town and she joined the club in my absence.

The fifties and sixties were the best time in the world to grow up. The music was great, the car were fantastic and drag racing was in it's prime. As you can see, I came by this wonderful hobby we enjoy pretty darn easy.

Somewhere in the middle of all this I spent 26 years with Xerox, McDonnell Information Systems and Fujitsu traveling throughout the United States, Canada, South America and Europe as a Manufacturing Systems Consultant, Project Manager and Regional Director, Professional Services.

Now it' Peggy's turn.

Growing up in a small town made it possible for my family to get around without a car. There are pictures of us sitting on a cars running board although, I do not remember us owning a car. When I was in Junior High School my dad bought a Buick 2 door sedan



and repainted it beige and green. In the ninth grade my father and I went to the Buick dealer and picked out a white Buick with red upholstery for my mom's Christmas present. Even though the car was white it turned out to be a lemon!



In 1957 my fathers job relocated us to Southern California. It must be noted, that my father and my brother knew nothing about cars.

When I married Norm I was surprised that car's could be such a large part of someone's life. Norm had a 1938 Chevrolet coupe that was a project in progress. I could not believe that one car could make so much noise, I was afraid the neighbors would complain about it. We did not have that car very long but the next car was so much fun. It was a 36 Chevrolet 2 door sedan. We would get our cassette recorder and drive around with the theme from the "Sting" playing. Like many of us at the time, this one was bartered for drapes and carpet.

A few years later I thought Norm had lost his mind when he brought home a 1958 Corvette that was multi- colored, no engine, no interior, no glass and weeds stuck everywhere. This car had no redeeming quality's except for the fact that it started Norm back doing car restorations.



From Your Accessories Chair





"Lets Talk Canadian" Article by Steve Branch

The year was 2006. I was freshly retired from my job of 33 years with one company. We were looking for something to do on that weekend. The weather was warm sunny, which is rare for Southern Ontario Canada, at that time of year. We jumped in our

everyday car ready to enjoy the day. I said let's drive up past my old farm and then on into the country north of there.

You have to remember that we are in the middle of Southern Ontario the city name is Cambridge. So we were heading north on Hwy (route) 24 over to Guelph. Then onto Hwy 6 north then making a left onto county road 7 thru the towns of Elora then Salem and on to Alma. Alma has a number of interesting things going on. There is an old guy there who sells Ford parts. But do not insult him in any way . . . he has a long memory and the story is well spread among the car guys. Once insulted, he would never sell you a part.

Also in Alma is this little restaurant call Margie's Kitchen, All home made food and bread fresh from the oven and still hot along with pies, Farmers Sausage locally made - just all the best food. So we had lunch there. Back on the road we traveled north again thru Parker and on to Tiviotdale. My old farm is not far from here. We made a right onto Hwy 9 east, and went for about 2 miles, then left on to county road 11. My property is 7th up on the right, 100 acres of flat land with about 10 acres of bush .The head waters for the Maitland River bubble up as a warm spring on my old property and give it its start. A beautiful fresh water spring and forms a warm stream which does not even freeze, even in very cold winters. I sold the farm back in 1994 which at the time was a great relief to me. Too cold in winter and too many bugs in summer *LOL*

Here I was having to turn on the wipers and wash the windshield of bugs - yes nothing changed much here. Next we're back on to Hwy 6 north again at the town of Mount Forest, a pretty little town which even has a grocery store I used to shop in. North again to Varney which has a stock car track. The place where many of our old cars spend their final days on Saturday evenings entertaining the local crowds. I remember it as being loads of fun.

Just up the road from here is this guy who collects cars and resells them. His name is Dave and I know him well. So we pull right in. We talk for a bit and then Dave says "Hey, I have a great car for you!" "What are you talking about?" I asked. He walks us around some old buildings and there sitting is a 1950 Meteor. It's very straight and painted a maroon red color. I kinda like it right away and so does Georgina. It's still running the old flat-head V8 and just a regular 3 speed trans no overdrive here. The interior looks like its never been sat in. Dave tells us that an old guy had it and that he kept it in a small garage and backed it out to clean and wax it about once a month, but really never drove it much. It's got 81,000 miles on it and that is original. That would mean that in 56 years the car had about 1450 miles put on it each year.

Anyway we drove it & made a deal to buy it. About a week later we were back to pick it up. At the same time we buy a 1954 Caddy for parts for Georgina and have him deliver it.

Back to the Meteor... we have to put it through the "Provincial Safety Check" which can be troublesome here in Ontario. But the mechanic tells me she's ready and that it did not need a thing. Very cool. So now we were cruising again. Oh did I say that after we left Dave we went for Ice Cream. A very pleasant ride though the country with lots of talk about our new purchases. We visited Owen Sound and looked at the boats coming and going. Right on Georgian Bay.

We very much enjoyed that car for a few years and then in 2009 in our downsizing, we sold it. As we both watched it drive away we said what did we do? For the next few years we looked for another one to replace it but none would measure up. We searched sorta off and on. Then in 2013 I was looking on line and saw a Meteor listed for sale. It was down in the Niagara wine region not very far from Niagara Falls.

Although not the same car, it was in very similar shape finished in gloss black. I did not know the owners but he seemed to know the car at the same time telling me he was really a Chevy guy, and had gotten the car in an interesting trade deal. Well we bought it . . . he delivered it to us and it was the same mechanic who then told me yes it passed and no it does not need anything. How cool is that? We still have the black Meteor to this day. It's a fine running car and gets far more than 1450 miles a year on it. As a matter of fact today is May 16th and we already have more than 1,450 miles on it since returning from California in mid April 2015.

You know it's funny we both seem to really like going for ice cream in this car. Do you think there might be a connection to the day we bought it? Or are we just hooked on old cars and ice cream, too? But that's another story...



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

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
