

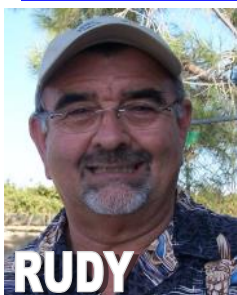

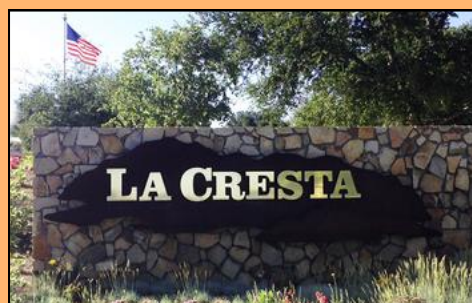
Hosted by Cal & Cheryl Westra at their home in La Cresta, California. Plans for the day include:

Getting to Know You:

New Member Gary Potts !!

GARY POTTS: 1951 Ford Victoria

I retired and bought a home in Moreno Valley in 2011 to be close to my three kids who live over in the LA basin. I bought the '51 Victoria in May '13 from a dealer in New Hampshire, off Hemmings. I drove from my home in Southern California to check the car out myself. My advice for anyone who thinks about doing that is either do a Canon Ball 3-dayer, or a 3-week snow baller.

VIN is: B1SP113549 Assembled in St Paul, Minn plant.

Cowl Codes (centered on the cowl behind the engine): SP 60 A AC 23B

848 A rare solid color car still in it's Raven Black paint. Ford introduced the Victoria in mid-January 1951 so 23 February assembly date makes it an early run car. It still has the assembly line chalk marks on the firewall and cowl (see pic).

The car's story is it was bought by a small dealership in Maine and was displayed on their one-car show-room. The dealership added the continental kit and the fender skirts. Their dealership plaque is on the dash and cost me a one point deduction for being an "adder". The car became the personal driver for the owners wife until he bought her a new T-Bird convertible in '57. The car was repainted in either the '70's or the 90's. Everything else is original. The car was in that family's hands until early 2013. Though a North East car it was always garaged and never driven during the winter. 75,000 miles so it was driven and not a trailer queen. I keep it in my garage. Never drive it in the rain or at night.



It's not my only Shoebox. I have a customized '50 Coupe, a '50 Tudor with a 351w, a '51 Tudor with a 302, AC and PS, a heavily customized, shaved, '51 Victoria and a restored '53 F-100.

I had the flathead rebuilt and added a larger 4-core radiator.

I entered the car in the Concourse Division. Total score was 865 out of 1,000. Lost 26 points for Exterior, 75 for interior, 23 for Engine, and 11 for Chassis. Had a few wrong/missing pieces like wrong hub caps and beauty trim rings, missing hood ornament, wrong radiator cap, and a couple incorrect bolts and fittings. The major deductions were for 63 year old wear and tear. Dearborn requires a 950 score. There were two fully restored 1951 Victorias at the event, and a fellow club member's Victoria got that award.

Knew I could get the lower level Rouge Award but I wanted to have the car point judged at the highest level. All I was expecting was the scoring sheets so I could see what I needed to fix.

Don't fully understand the judging but my award was:
Second Place
Ford 1949-1953 Closed.



I would encourage all Flatheaders to join the Early Ford V-8 club at both local and national level-----and take their car to an event.

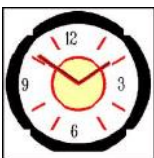

Password security, from an expert:

Simple Tips to Keep Your Online Identity Safe

Passwords are sometimes the only thing between your data and cyber criminals. Passwords are the only thing between SAFE DATA vs STOLEN DATA.

If a cyber criminal gains access to your password, they can not only use them to access one account, but if you reuse that password across multiple accounts, guess what, they can get into ALL of your accounts and steal financial data and help themselves to a lot of your digital life. So, it makes sense for you to pay attention to and choose better passwords. Better than just the simple "abcde" Or "password password." The most common password is "12345." Common, really !? You need to:

1. Change your passwords. Perhaps every year, or if a company has been breached, change it immediately!
2. Create Stronger passwords:
 - A. A word, repeat it;
 - B. ideally, put in some special characters, a number, some punctuation. Avoid your favorite food, or your birthday, or names of your kids.
 - C. There are free password generators available online.
3. Don't reuse your password. Yes, it makes things much easier for you if you have the one password for everything, but it's a little bit like a master key. If that master key is compromised, now somebody can open all the doors in your life. Same for your passwords. If your password is compromised on one site, then other sites that have stronger security measures, than can be opened using that same password are compromised. The **Golden Rule** is: use different passwords for all your accounts, particularly those accounts where you care . . . the accounts that store your money or have lots of sensitive information about you.

Now that you are changing your passwords and creating stronger ones, change them on a regular basis, and maybe a password manager might be a good idea to help you remember them all. No writing them down on sticky notes anymore.

4. Use a Password Manager, such as the free Norton Identity Safe.
go to: <https://identitysafe.norton.com/password-generator>
5. Enable Two-Factor authentication. Many sites offer it now. It is an additional layer of security to your account by requiring you to type in something you know (your password) in addition to something you have (which is a code that gets sent to you via text message on your phone to make it much more difficult for the bad guys to get your information.) So, even if your password is compromised they can't get in without that special code.
6. A lot of people forget about paying particular attention to their email account. Your email account in many ways is the door to your digital life. Think about how many times you've had to reset your password. You reset your password in many cases by having them send you a link to your email. So, if a cyber criminal has access to your email, then he can reset a whole bunch of your passwords and get into and take over your entire digital life. So, the EMAIL, which many people don't think about to keep secure is very important.

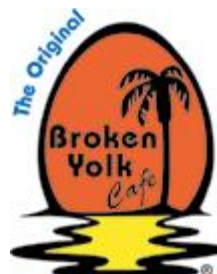
