





#### Dan & Bonnie Krehbiel took The Great 2016 Southwestern Tour!



This year Bonnie and I decided to take the 500 mile tour through Southern Colorado ending in Southeastern Utah and Monument Valley, Arizona. We took our 1940 Mercury Convertible for this trip. Starting out in Canon City, Colorado we rode the Royal Gorge Railroad in a 1950 era Vista Dome Car. Later we went shopping in Florence, Colorado which had many antique stores. Next day onto Gunnison, Colorado where we woke up with frost and ice on our cars. There were about 20 Early Fords from seven different states. Next from Gunnison, Colorado you could drive over a 10,000 ft. pass or Monarch Pass which was 11.312 ft. The cars all made the 10,000 foot pass with no breakdowns. The only car with problems was a 50 Ford Tudor with a C-4 Automatic

that broke something in the transmission and came back to the motel on a trailer. Next day to Bluff, Utah, Natural Bridge National Monument and Gooseneck State Park. This was beautiful red cliff driving country.We stayed the last night in Mexican Hat, Utah and rode a tour jeep all around Monument Valley, Arizona.

I had vapor lock twice on my 40 Mercury so I will install an electric fuel pump. Total trip mileage was 2,900 miles on our 40 Mercury.
