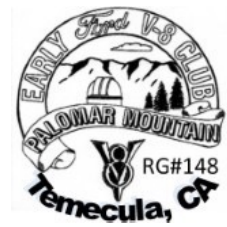

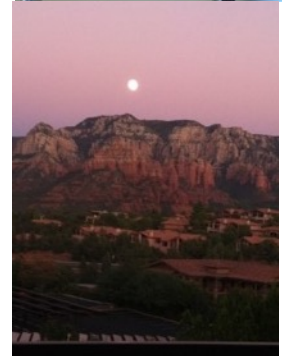
Harris Tour 2016

This year's **Harris Tour** was precipitated by the selfish thoughts of your's truly, Jay Harris, as a way to celebrate my 80th birthday with my many friends in the Early Ford V-8 Club. And so it was conceived in January, 2016, and took place over six days in mid-October. A total of 49 members, driving 25 cars – 16 vintage, and 9 modern, made the trek through some of the most beautiful country imaginable in Arizona and Utah. The group enjoyed visiting four **National Parks - Grand Canyon, Capital Reef, Bryce Canyon, and Zion**, plus numerous National Monuments and State Parks. When it was all over, about 1600 miles were covered, with two Early V-8s unable to complete the journey. Following is a day by day diary of events:

The tour assembled the morning of October 13th in Temecula for a brief driver's meeting before heading east toward Blythe for a lunch stop. BUT WAIT A MINUTE! landing there we visited **Sunset Crater and Wupatki National Monuments** north of Flagstaff, then picniced in Thorpe Park and visited an historic **Santa Fe Railroad** train station. Soon it was time to make our way up to the **South Rim**, where several V-8ers had booked accommodations at the historic **El Tovar**, plus other lodging along the rim of the canyon.

Day four. The entire morning was devoted to 'explore on your own'. Some people took walks along the rim, others enjoyed a tram tour out to **Hermit's Rest**, while others sat in the **El Tovar** dining room and just relaxed. At 1:00 the tour gathered at the **Desert View** parking area for the short, 170 mile run to **Kayenta, Arizona** for the night.

Day five. Today we made our way into southern **Utah**, with stops at **Goosenecks State Park in Monument Valley, Natural Bridges National Monument, and Capital Reef National Park**. On the way up to **Natural Bridges NM** we encountered three miles of unpaved road with lots of switchbacks and washboard surfaces on SR 316, totally overlooked by your intrepid tour leader. Turns out that the Road Atlas he was using didn't show such a 'glitch' in the road, where, on further investigation, the **AAA Utah** map clearly shows **Muley Point Overlook** with 'dirt swichbacks'. Janet and I were sure some followers might have had 'just about enough' of such incompetence but, as it turns out, most drivers commented that the experience was one of the highlights of the tour. After lunch on picnic tables located behind the **Natural Bridges NM** Visitor's Center we departed for Hanksville, some 100 miles north. On the way is a spectacular bridge that spans the **Colorado River** named the **Hite Bridge**, and we all stopped there for lots of photo opps. Then it was on to **Capital Reef National Park** before arriving in **Torrey, Utah**, and the **Capital Reef Resort**, our lodging for the night and the site of the much anticipated **Jay Harris' 80th birthday party** ! The party got under way at 5:30, with beer and wine as refreshments, and several long time friends and tour participants got up to tell stories only mom could love. Then it was time for dinner, then the finale, a cake with the number **80** attached. 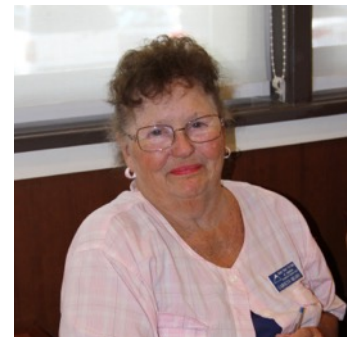
