

Special Drawing: – \$165 was collected with \$82 going to the club and \$83 won by Ron Shedd.


Being no further business to come before the meeting and on motion duly made the meeting adjourned at 9:51 a.m.





HARRIS TOUR DEBACLES

Hi everyone! In the spirit of contributing material for Bob to use in our wonderful Valve Chatter newsletter, here are some perhaps bizarre incidents that have occurred over hosting the HARRIS TOUR over the last 49 years. Keep in mind, most of these occurred long before Google Maps, Mapquest, etc. Back in the day I relied solely on phone contacts with the local Chamber of Commerce or Visitor's Center, and, of course, my now dog-eared Road Atlas!

On a tour to the Pacific Northwest in the mid-eighties I needed to find a suitable park in Mesquite, Nevada for our lunch stop on our first day out. I talked to a delightful young lady at the C of C, telling her I needed a park with lots of trees, and parking to accommodate 15 to 20 cars. My description was intended to let her know we would need lots of shade since we were traveling in July. She described a beautiful park, the town's pride and joy. We were 'all set'. Well, the big day arrived and we pulled into the parking lot adjacent to a recently opened park with 'lots of trees'. Problem was, they were all new as well — no shade!! There was limited shade under a canopy built on a long, thin ribbon of concrete on which some picnic tables were placed end to end. There was only sufficient shade if it was high noon (which it wasn't). We ended up all packed into and around the picnic tables. Not exactly what I had in mind!

On a HARRIS TOUR which found us scheduled to stop for our daily picnic lunch at their beautiful City Park in Prescott, Arizona, I received a cell phone call from a local Early Ford V8 Club member when we were about 20-30 minutes out of town. He had heard we were going to stop there and invited us to join other members at their clubhouse, eat lunch, kick tires, etc. He would send a member, driving an **Early** V8, to greet us, and all we had to do was follow him a few miles to the clubhouse location.

Sounded great! Well, we hooked up, my car right behind him, and the rest of the tour following. The whole idea fell completely apart within two blocks! He drove too fast, which would have been OK if we weren't driving through the busy district of Prescott, with signal lights at every corner, and several turns needed to get to our destination. In no time at all our tour line was fractured by red lights and unseen turns. I had to make a decision – continue to follow him (I had no idea where he was going), or hang back and hope he noticed. Well, I followed him and we arrived at the clubhouse with only two of our tour in tow. Almost immediately I started receiving anguished phone calls, "where are you? We're sitting at a Texaco station at 5th and Main," etc, etc. Then more calls from other locations in town. The locals sent members out to retrieve the 'lost' folks and eventually we were all together again, albeit with some ruffled feathers! Conclusion: NEVER alter the tour plans by saying, 'just follow me'! Unless the route is out on the open road – no signal lights, etc. It doesn't work!!

I LOVE this one! Tour planning always requires at least one fuel stop each day depending on that day's mileage <u>and</u> the gas mileage of the average Early V8. Well, a Shell station was selected after a phone chat with the local Chamber of Commerce. We were all set, right?? Not exactly. When we arrived I was dismayed to see that this little station had exactly <u>two pumps!</u> And we had 18 cars on the tour!! <u>And</u>, the town was so small there we no other stations. (Today I can simply zoom in via satellite on Google Maps and take a close look, but not back then).

Now, last but certainly not least. On one of our tours to a Western National Meet in British Columbia, Canada (the HARRIS TOUR has been to Canada three times), we travelled along the California, Oregon, and Washington coasts. In Oregon, directions to a city park were provided by, once again, the Chamber of Commerce. The friendly lady gave explicit directions, for which I was very grateful, and I took careful notes. As we approached town I was to get in the right lane and turn right on Maple St and proceed just three blocks to the park. SIMPLE. Well, the big day came, the business district was approaching, I got in the right lane, driving very slowly so as not to miss it. No Maple St! We had a lot cars that year -23 I think, so it was imperative that I find curbside parking immediately to give me time to assess the situation. Once stopped it was decided that we would leave the group, go into town and ask directions to their city park, and return, prepared to lead them to it. Only one problem – I had neglected to instruct the driver of the car directly behind us to stay put – otherwise the whole tour line would follow us!

They did, of course, so now we had a massive line of cars following us through the busy business district – signal lights and all! At two red lights I approached people using the cross walks to tell me where their city park was. Neither knew! With lots of patience and determination we lead the tour line into a quiet neighborhood where we could stop briefly and I went to each car to tell them they were on their own to find local fast food or café and that we would all meet at the north end of town in **one hour**. Now, you ask – what happened to Maple St?? Read on. Their park is bordered on the south by Maple St, and on the north by Birch St. In the three blocks distance from the park to our travel route on US 101, the two streets Merged into <u>one street</u>, and it's name was – you guessed it – **Birch St.!!** Ah, the best laid plans!

The coupe has low mileage with mostly original paint and upholstery. When I bought the car, the seller thought it came from southern California- which seems credible since there is no rust.

Is there anyone in your regional club that I could ask on the chance that he would recognize the coupe from pictures and remember some history?

The car has the original coach maroon paint with some of the red pinstripe remaining. The paint is all original (wheels repainted) except that the left rear fender is repainted- no body damage. Paint is in good condition except at the left hood vertical side where it is flaking off. The upholstery is original, including the rumble seat. The odometer shows 23,000 miles. The right side of the intake manifold has a spot weld.
