We had an interesting program from officer Mike Lassig from the California Highway Patrol. He had several important messages to share, I think the main one was don't touch your phone while driving!



Early Ford V-8 Foundation Museum

History

The Early Ford V-8 Foundation Museum (Museum) is a one-of-a-kind operation that is dedicated to 1932-1953 Ford history. The Museum began March 1993 in California as a non-profit public benefit corporation (501 c-3). In 2006, the Museum purchased land in Auburn, Indiana and, in 2008, registered the Museum with Indiana Secretary of State.



What began in 2009 as an 8,000 sf museum, known as Phase I, is now a 27,000 sq. ft. facility, thanks to the efforts of many Early Ford V-8 enthusiasts. The 27,000 SF facility consists of three major sections: Original Phase I a new flathead speed equipment display, featuring dozens of popular speed accessories of the '32-'53 era; a display of a <u>1926 Ford Model T</u> powered by a decked-out Ford V-8 60 hp and a <u>1935 Miller Ford race car</u> on loan from the Indianapolis Speedway Museum; a display of Ford V-8 powered industrial equipment; Ford Farm display as well as Flathead V-8 engines, transmissions, rear axles, etc. including cut-a-way models, a "1940s Ford Garage", the Research Library, Gift Shop and an incredible Ford Toy Truck display on loan; and, Section 2 The Frank Corey Gallery which displays many of museum's 1932-53 Ford vehicles. The late Frank Corey of New Mexico, donated museum's first car back in 2009, an original 1946 Mercury Coupe as well as eleven other cars and an incredible cash donation. A children's area will be added; and, Section 3 The "Floyd Motors" Dealership which is a 10,000-sf addition funded by Joe Floyd of South Dakota and designed and built by Group Delphi replicating incredible, period-accurate, 1936 Ford Dealership. Floyd Motors incorporates a rendition of the iconic Ford Rotunda. Centerpiece of the Rotunda is a 1936 Ford Stainless Steel Sedan sitting on a turntable and visible from outside of the Rotunda through its center window.

A Look Ahead

What started with less than 10 cars 10 years ago, the Museum now has 75+ and forecasts over 150 within the next 10 years. The Museum's Phase III: "*Building the Future*" is the latest campaign to address space for much-needed conservation and preservation center, vehicle storage, educational facilities and an expanded exhibition/display area for multi-purpose events. The Museum's goal is \$2.6M with a total of \$1.5M collected to date to build the second building. Construction began on the new building earthwork with groundbreaking on July 15, 2021. 





