

Identifying the best Flathead Transmission

Now since these transmissions are so old, a lot of the crucial parts could have been interchanged just to keep the vehicle on the road. The next important detail you need to look for is the synchronized 2nd and 3rd gear. On all gear sets 1st will be unsynchronized. Below you can see me pointing to the brass synchronizer ring itself, take a good look at this setup, on a non synchronized transmission there will only be one set of synchronized teeth on either side of the synchronizer hub and not 4. You'll be looking for 4!



Last but not least, you'll be looking for the correct transmission mount. This will be solely for the application for which you are buying the transmission, but I would like to show you what the 1939 trans had originally. Below you can see the ears on the 39 case, make sure these are not cracked or broken, very typical for them to crack. Second picture below shows the truck style trans mounts, they are a little stronger than the 39 mounts.





From my experience and experience of the Hot Rodders before me, these transmissions are the best for traditional Hot Rodding. Lincoln Zephyr gears should be noted as one of the best as well but are much harder to get a hold of and expensive nowadays. But let's not give the wrong impression, these transmissions are getting pretty pricey, a professionally rebuilt top loader three speed are going for \$900-\$1,100. It's in your best interest to find a good candidate for a rebuild and rebuild it yourself, a worn case with bad internals could cost up to \$1,000 in part cost alone. The good news is, all the gears are being reproduced and can be replaced, and if you have all usable gears then a rebuild kit itself is going for \$200. So take the time to find the right one for you and get in the garage and Get Your Shift Together!

A TECH TIP FROM JEROME MUELLER

For any of you who have had difficulty with your trunk support arms not staying up and the lid falling down on your head, here is a solution that worked for me. Remove the support arm to the bench. Flex the arm to approximately 90 degrees and maintain this position between two solid surfaces (I stuck the arm between two shelves). Secure this flexed position by tying a rope through the holes on each end (I used a surgeon's knot). You can now remove the support from between the solid surfaced and the notch for the stud will be accessible to work on. Use a rotary tool with a grinding wheel (I used a Dremel) and deepen the notch by 3/8 of an inch. This will allow the support arm to extend further when the trunk lid is open and improves the mechanical advantage of the arm so that the lid stays up firmly. I painted the exposed metal before reinstalling. The support arms I have on my 1940 coupe are from Drake. They are no longer being manufactured by any of the old parts suppliers that I contacted so I either had to modify my support arms or convert to the gas struts. I wanted to keep my Ford as original as possible so I undertook this modification to see if my solution would work. I never had an issue with the trunk lid staying up on my original 1940 coupe which I bought in 1953. At this time I do not have an original support arm to compare to the Drake arm so I have to wonder whether the Drake NOS stock did not have the correct depth made in the notch. This modification worked for me.






A BLAST FROM THE PAST FROM KEN & MERLEEN MAJERS

Car of the Month Ken & Merleen Magers' 1935 Ford 3-window Coupe

This completely restored Ford originally sold for \$560 in December of 1934 and was painted Cordoba Gray at the factory. It boasted an 85 horsepower, flathead V-8 engine and had always been taken care of by Merleen's dad, Smitty. When the original owner's husband died in 1973, the lady gave the car to her trusted mechanic, Merle G. Smith, "Smitty," because he had done such a wonderful job over the years. Smitty was a mechanic's mechanic who often created and manufactured parts whenever they couldn't be obtained from the factory as Ken can attest when he went to restore this old car. Merle had always wanted to restore the car himself as it had so few miles on it (20,000 original miles) and he felt it was a car worthy of a total restoration.

Merle kept the car stored in various garages and storage containers over the years waiting for the time he could do the job himself or else when someone offered the "big bucks" or a new car for the '35 vehicle. No offers ever came until one day a gentleman wrote him a check for \$17,000 for the car. When signing the pink slip Merle ("Smitty") heard the man say what a great hot rod it was going to make and ... Well, Smitty tore up the check and showed the man the door. Smitty was reported to have said that no one was going to make a hot rod out of that car! And he meant it!

As time went on Merle got older and suffered a stroke and in November of 1996, he died before ever starting the restoration. Ken thought he'd like a project for himself, and felt that he'd like to restore the old '35 as a tribute to his father-in-law, so he set out to get the car from Merleen's mother. It took two years of patience and cajoling before his mother-in-law finally decided to let him have the car and it was another two years before he retired so he could have the time the project deserved.

Ken's first step was to start taking the car apart piece by piece logging each and every nut and bolt in a log with a description of the color of the part and where the part had been located. Then he took the car up to LA and had the body, fenders and wheels hot dipped to get rid of all the old rust and paint.

We also found parts throughout the U.S. and Canada during our yearly vacations including the grille which was found in Ohio. Ken consulted every manual and expert he could talk to and finally decided to join our Palomar Mountain Ford V-8 Club where a wonderful, enthusiastic group of Ford guys offered all kinds of help including parts, materials, advice, and experience. In fact, our own Bill Mon-teleone did the body work and paint that turned "Smitty" into the beauty she is today. This 75 year old car is now painted a beautiful Dearborn blue, and has LaBaron Bonney upholstery just like the original except that it's a deep burgundy red leather. Although Burgundy is not an original Henry color, Merleen is sure it completes the look they were going for. Red pin striping and red powder coating on the wire wheels completed the car's trim package.

Ken also installed hydraulic brakes because of the busy, crazy roads around here and the Magers' wanted the car to be a driver not a



trailer queen. Even the old radio has been restored to pick up all the AM stations within a 20 mile radius. The Magers don't often drive "Smitty" out in the rain, due to the vacuum windshield wiper system, nor do they like to drive it at night due to the 6 -volt light system, but they love the waves and thumbs up signs they get from other motorists.

We feel this off the frame restoration Ken did, plus the years it took to painstakingly put the car back together shows the love we felt for "Smitty" and is a pretty good tribute to Merle. And when the car wins trophies it just confirms our belief that Merle is looking down on us and smiling at the great job that was done on his old car. Hopefully the judges at the Western Meet agree!
